Callery Pear

Cultivated for the purpose of suiting narrow locations, the Ornamental Pear 'Capital' has a narrow growth habit reaching a maximum of 3 metres wide. The glossy leaves transition form dark green to purple or reddish-orange in the Autumn months providing an impressive display before dropping. Small sweetly-scented white flowers appear in Spring in large clusters accenting the leaf prior to the colour change. Growing well in an open to protected sunny position, this species is frost resistant but drought tender.
