Queensland Firewheel

This tropical gem commonly known as the Queensland Firewheel Tree earns its name from the vibrant orange to red flowers which bloom from late Summer to mid-Autumn. The flowers are arranged in a circular pattern like spokes on a wheel and have an attractive drooping shape growing in abundance to almost conceal the leaf from view. Establishing in 3 to 4 years, this species is slow growing but long-lived.
