White Mahogany

Native to the coastal regions of NSW, the White Mahogany prefers welldrained, moist soils and an open sunny position. Large white flowers appear in Spring and Summer and are a major source of pollen for the bee-keeping industry. Reaching an average of 30 metres and having a dense broad crown, the White Mahogany has all the makings of the ideal shade tree.
