Grey Ironbark

The Grey Ironbark is grown for its dense spreading crown and dramatic floral display which sees fluffy cream flowers blanketing the tree from Autumn to early-Winter. Often planted in parks and large gardens where there is space to spread, the Grey Ironbark is fast growing and long lived its dark-green glossy leaves making it a lovely shade tree. It prefers full sun and once established can tolerate periods of drought.
