Message to our Community

Welcome to the project update newsletter for Epping Ward.

City of Parramatta Council has commenced 77 projects in your ward this financial year worth nearly \$31.9 million. These include footpaths, roads and drainage upgrades, which are listed in this document according to their funding groups.

We have currently completed 36 projects, worth \$7.3 million.

Upgrades to Epping Pool and Edwin Ross Reserve, and construction of the Somerville Park Amenities Building are three of the key projects for Epping Ward. These projects are important to ensure the needs of the community are met now and into the future. See further details on these projects and more in this edition of the Epping Ward Update.

Somerville Park Amenities Building

Council has finished constructing a new amenities building at Somerville Park, Eastwood. The upgrade will provide the community and local sporting clubs with much-needed new facilities. The improvement works include a new sporting amenities building with additional storage, new barbecue, picnic tables and seating, and additional tree planting.



Epping Pool

The Dence Park Masterplan was adopted in December 2019. Following this, Council is focusing on delivering Stage 1, which includes a new eightlane 50m pool, sky bridge, amenities building, spectator seating, indoor pool, and water play

facilities. A number of technical specialists (including architects, geotechnical engineer, and a pool recreation planner) are currently working with Council to develop a more detailed concept for Epping Pool so we can bring the masterplan to life.

Edwin Ross Reserve

Construction works will start work in early June at Edwin Ross Reserve in Carlingford. The works will include a new playground, a multi-use informal court for games such as Newcombeball, seating, picnic settings and shelters, improved entrances, fencing and accessibility of the site, new turf, and shade tree and shrub planting.

The park was designed in consultation with schoolchildren at the nearby Carlingford Public School and residents living around the reserve.

The works are anticipated to be completed by August 2020.



Better Neighbourhood Program

The Better Neighbourhood Program (BNP) is a successful, long running Council initiative that aims to improve the liveability of our neighbourhoods and centres outside of the Parramatta CBD. It delivers capital upgrades to centres with the goal of enhancing safety, vitality and economic prosperity.

Drainage Program

As part of our stormwater drainage renewal program, we repair and re-line stormwater drainage pits and pipes, as well as increase inflow capacity, in order to improve the operation of the drainage network. Even in areas far away from creeks and rivers, local flooding can occur if there is insufficient drainage. By continuing to maintain and improve Council's stormwater drainage systems, the impacts of local flooding can be reduced or eliminated.

Stronger Communities Fund

The NSW Government established the Stronger Communities Fund to provide amalgamated councils with funding to kick start the delivery of projects that improve community infrastructure and services. The Stronger Communities Fund includes two programs:

- Community grant program: Distributes \$1 million in grants of up to \$50,000 to incorporated, not-for-profit community groups to implement projects that build more vibrant, sustainable and inclusive local communities.
- Major projects program: Allocates \$14 million to fund larger scale priority infrastructure and service projects that deliver long-term economic and social benefits to communities.

Council is investing in a range of upgrade projects in the Parramatta CBD.


