## Alkira and North Rocks Traffic Light Upgrade

We started to put in traffic lights at the crossing of Alkira Road and North Rocks Road.

Work started in April 2021.

The road will be wider.

We will put in a new lane to turn right.

Some of the work is finished.

All the work should be finished by the end of September 2021.

#### Max Ruddock Reserve

We also made the toilet blocks better.

The project cost \$750 thousand to build.

## Hunts Creek Bridge and Walking Track

Northern Drive Reserve is getting a new bridge and walking track.

Work will start in the middle of 2021.

## **Junction Road Carpark**

Council is building 100 car park spaces at Junction Road.

The car park is for Commuters. Commuters are people that travel to work.

We want people to park their car and take the bus to work.

The new carpark will be near Winston Hills bus stop on the M2 Motorway.

City of Parramatta Council will work on this project with the Hills Shire Council and Transport for NSW. **TfNSW** for short.

TfNSW will pay \$2.5million to put in

- A new kerb and footpath
- A pavement
- Gardens
- Car park spaces

The council is asking people what they think about these changes.





## Woodstock Shops and Douglass Road Playground

We made Woodstock Road Shops and Douglass Avenue Reserve Playground better.

Woodstock Road shops now have more plants and trees.

There are more places to sit, better paths and a street library.

The new playground at Douglass Avenue Reserve will open at the end of July 2021.

#### **Perry Street Carpark**

The Government and TfNSW will work together to build 135 car park spaces.

The car park spaces will be for commuters. Commuters are people that travel to work.

They can then park their car and take the bus to work instead.

We will have less cars on the road if people do this.

We will talk to the community about the plan.

We want to hear what you think.

Work will start in the middle of 2021.

Work should be finished by the middle of 2022.
