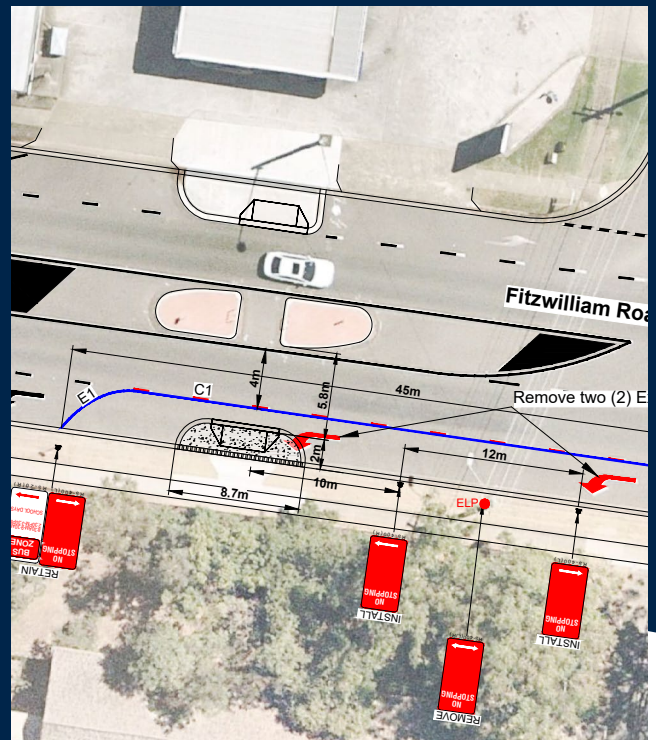
Toongabbie Public School

Work on Phillip Street

In 2018 we started a big project to make Phillip Street better.

We have finished part 1 of the work.

We have made the path at Church Street and Smith Street bigger and better.

We have made the crossings safer.

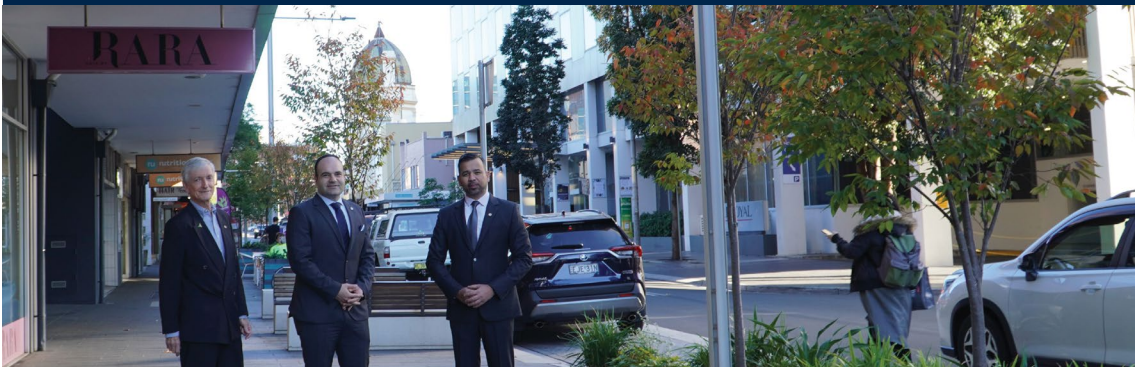
You can sit outside at restaurants.

Phillip lane has not had many customers because of COVID-19 and building works.

We helped them to have more space for people to eat outside.

The government gave us money to do this.

Changes to City River Foreshore

The last part of the 20km Parramatta Valley Cycleway is now open.

This is called the Escarpment Boardwalk.

It is a path for people to walk or bike on.

It links Parramatta Park to Melrose Park.

The path goes next to the Parramatta River.

You can use the stairs on the new boardwalk to get to Stewart Street and Macarthur Street.

The project cost \$18 million to build.

The boardwalk is the first part of the project to make Parramatta Quay better.

Work will start soon on Charles Street Square.
