

Online Citizenship Ceremonies

I am delighted that Council has resumed its citizenship ceremony program to support local residents. Stay tuned for information on upcoming ceremonies on Council's website.

Major project updates

I am thrilled that early works have begun on the Sydney Metro West, and construction is continuing on 5 Parramatta Square and Parramatta Light Rail. Construction has also begun on the new Aquatic and Leisure Centre, and the world class institution of Powerhouse Parramatta is expected to begin early next year. These facilities will become landmarks in our City and I look forward to seeing them evolve and service our growing community.

Council's New Home

Council has purchased the building at 9 Wentworth Street with plans to remodel the interior to become its new administrative headquarters.

From 2023, corporate staff and the Customer Contact Centre will have a new home in the seven-storey Wentworth Street building, close to the \$2.7 billion Parramatta Square and the Light Rail route.

With many major projects transforming our City, the new office space will help us to continue delivering these exciting projects into the future from the heart of the growing Parramatta CBD.

Local Government Elections happening this December

Local Government Elections were postponed due to circumstances presented by COVID-19. Previously planned for 4 September, the NSW Government has selected 4 December as the new election date. Voting is mandatory for all residents of the City of Parramatta Local Government Area.

Building set to begin on new aquatic and leisure centre

With the planning, approvals and design of Parramatta's new \$88.6 million aquatic and leisure centre completed, the only way to go is up. In fact, site preparation is underway to enable just that – construction of this muchanticipated project has begun.

Prior to the NSW lockdown and the pause placed on the building industry, construction firm Lipman worked closely with an arborist to supervise the removal of 186 trees and to nominate specific tree protection zones. Importantly, a total of 489 trees will be replanted on site in the final stages of the project as part of the landscape masterplan.

The 40,000-square-metre indooroutdoor pool and leisure facility will blend seamlessly into the leafy natural environment of Parramatta Park.

Top soil has also been removed to allow for piling and bulk excavation on site.

The new community facility is expected to be completed in 2023.

5 Parramatta Square will be WHERE IT'S AT

It's time to get excited! Council's new flagship community, cultural and civic facility – 5 Parramatta Square – is on track to open to the public in mid-2022. With striking architecture and thoughtful design, the people of Parramatta can look forward to world-class community and cultural experiences in a state-of-the-art hub dedicated to connection, participation and learning.

5 Parramatta Square will be a 'smart' building with in-built, environmentally sensitive design features, digital connectivity throughout, and technology-enhanced community meeting rooms and function spaces. A ground-floor café focused on health and wellbeing will have indoor and outdoor seating opening onto the Square. Customers will be able to dine in, grab and go, or 'click and collect', whether they're working in the building or just visiting. Council meetings will be held in the new Council Chambers overlooking Parramatta Square.

Light rail delivering a greener Parramatta

The Parramatta Light Rail team has launched a Tree Offset Strategy, which will see the local environment

significantly greener than when the project began.

Trees will be planted along the alignment and in surrounding streets, parks and reserves, contributing to urban greening not just along the rail line, but also in the general area.

Up to eight trees will be planted for every tree removed to make way for the project. To support local wildlife, 77 nesting boxes have also been installed across the alignment. Overall, the project will see more than 3,500 new trees planted – and replanting is already underway.

Stage 1 of the Parramatta Light Rail, connecting Westmead to Carlingford via the Parramatta CBD and Camellia, is expected to open in 2023.

Do you receive early flood warnings?

The City of Parramatta is among the state's most flash flood-affected areas. To help keep our community safe, we've developed a free, easy-to-use, flood warning service: FloodSmart Parramatta.

Developed in partnership with NSW State Emergency Service, Bureau of Meteorology, NSW Department of Planning Industry and Environment, and Sydney Water, there are currently seven areas across Parramatta identified to receive early-warning flood information, with more to come soon.

When the FloodSmart Parramatta system predicts flooding is likely, you'll

get an early-warning message via text, email or phone (you choose!). You can sign up to receive warnings for as many areas that you need to know about, such as where you work or live, where your children go to school, or where your friends and relatives live.

Dundas Village Shops

The Dundas Village Shops will be getting a makeover later this year, following two rounds of community consultation. The \$150,000 project is part of Council's Better Neighbourhood Program, and includes the installation of a new shade sail over the picnic seating out the front of the centre, new seating in front of the shops, tree planting, street library, community noticeboard and new centre signage.

Arthur Phillip Park Masterplan

The masterplan considers the important roles the park currently plays, and how to provide a better park experience for all in the future. The community prioritised four key areas during the masterplan consultations:

- · Improve circuit path and accessibility
- Upgrade district playground/social facilities
- Provide a water play facility
- Improve the playing field

Binalong Park Masterplan

Thank you to those who provided feedback to inform the development of the draft Binalong Park masterplan. We received 802 responses across three rounds of community consultation

Council adopted the Binalong Park masterplan on 26 July 2021. It provides a blueprint for the park, identifies opportunities to improve the layout of recreational facilities and reviews existing amenities buildings. The masterplan also considers future recreational requirements such as providing local meeting rooms or social spaces. The delivery of sporting fields and community assets is also highlighted.

Upgrades to Epping Leisure and Learning Centre

Construction works have started on Epping Leisure and Learning Centre, which is located under Epping Library. The upgrade works include installing additional partitioning walls to create new meeting rooms and a new foyer to allow for access to the meeting rooms. The works are anticipated to be completed by the end of 2021 and will deliver four additional rooms.

Pedestrian improvements at Fitzwilliam Road, Old Toongabbie

Council is reviewing pedestrian crossings and the need for crossing improvements at a number of local schools. Fitzwilliam Road, located at Old Toongabbie, can be particularly busy on school days. To support pedestrians crossing there, a kerb extension will be constructed on the south side of Fitzwilliam Road at the existing pedestrian refuge island, west of Picasso Crescent (outside Toongabbie Public School). Council has completed community consultation and, construction works are anticipated to complete late 2021.

Carmen Drive upgrade multi award winner!

The Carmen Drive Reinvigoration Project was a hugely successful and popular \$930,000 upgrade to a neighbourhood activity centre, including a new short-term car park, new playground, new amenities block and a streetscape redesign. On-site community consultation sessions, letters, and an extensive social media campaign saw residents and businesses join together to shape a new vision for the Carmen Drive shopping centre. Together, they shifted the focus for the upgrade from 'liveability' to 'love-ability'. The project won the Greater Sydney Commission Planning Awards 2021 in the category of 'Great Community Collaboration' and the Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia (IPWEA) NSW & ACT Awards 2021 in the category of 'Community Precinct Award'.

Parking just got easier

The City of Parramatta is undergoing a significant transformation, and that often means road works and changes to traffic conditions, including onstreet parking. However, Council's Parking Finder can easily help you locate parking. Parking Finder works in 'real time', just enter the type of parking (on-street, kiss and ride, accessible parking, multi-level car park station etc.) and the amount of time you need, and Parking Finder will show you what's available.

Alternatively, enter the details of your destination and Parking Finder will show you parking options nearby.

If you're using on-street parking, Council has made paying for parking easier. Download the Easy Park app on your mobile phone and follow the instructions or look for the pink Easy Park information on parking meters.

Major improvements for local schools

City of Parramatta Council has secured more than \$4.7 million under the Federal Government Stimulus Commitments on Road Safety Program (School Zone Infrastructure). The funding will support 18 projects across the LGA. Four projects, designed to allow students to walk and cycle safely to school, were completed in 2020/21 at Epping Public School, Rosehill Public School, Parramatta Marist High School and Darcy Road Public School. Fourteen projects are planned for local schools during 2021/22. The improved pedestrian facilities will promote active transport by increasing the ability for students to walk and cycle safely to school.


