

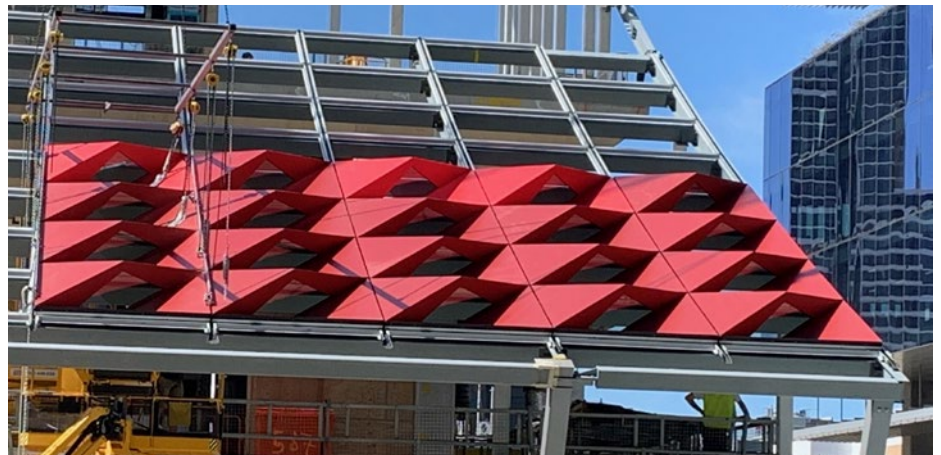
Extra vouchers have been automatically added to your account if you are an existing customer, but if you haven't

## Parramatta's new community facility progress update

Council's new flagship building, PHIVE, 5 Parramatta Square, is on track to open mid-2022. Designed in partnership with award-winning French architect Manuelle Gautrand and Australian architectural firms Lacoste Stevenson and Design Inc., the iconic building design is clearly emerging within Parramatta Square. The building's unique façade, with its vibrant red colour scheme, is currently being installed and the internal fit-out of the building is taking shape. The building will be home to the new city branch library, community meeting rooms, exhibition and function spaces, and a new state-of-the-art Council Chambers.

## Parramatta Light Rail tracking along



Construction progress on Stage 1 of the Parramatta Light Rail continues in 2022, with ongoing track

installation, landscaping and road works being delivered.

Areas in the Parramatta CBD have been transformed following the completion of major light rail construction. A lively activation continues on Parramatta's 'Eat Street', between Lennox Bridge and George Street, to encourage visitors to explore the area and show their support to local businesses.

Temporary fencing was removed along Macquarie Street between O'Connell Street and Horwood Place. Macquarie Street is now permanently one-way

eastbound. Pedestrians are reminded to look both ways while crossing the street, and cyclists and drivers are encouraged to take extra care and observe the changed traffic conditions.

Track installation was completed across sections of the alignment at North Parramatta and Carlingford, and construction of the new Stabling and Maintenance Facility at Camellia is underway.

### Award Recipients

#### Young Citizen of the Year in honour of David Shakespeare OAM

##### ★ Winner — Alicia Judge

Alicia is passionate about helping everyone, especially children with additional needs. She works at Scribbles and Giggles Childcare Centres as an Inclusion and Diversity Manager. Her role involves many out-of-hours work to support and guide families in accessing the right tools customised to their child's needs. Alicia mentors over 80 employees to ensure they are well-educated and informed about each child's needs, and has created a community where families, educators and children collaborate to achieve an inclusive educational and lifestyle plan. She has been involved in many charity and community events, in addition to her voluntary time spent supporting and consulting with local families.

#### Citizen of the Year

##### ★ Winner — Amar Singh

Amar is the founding president of Turbans 4 Australia, a Sikh charity organisation based in the Parramatta LGA. His passion is forming connections with people from all walks of life and breaking down the barriers of fear and misunderstanding while following the core Sikh values of equality, respect and service to humanity. Amar's contributions are entirely voluntary, often providing assistance in areas where there are large gaps in support, especially for the culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) community. Throughout the pandemic Amar has set up a local community pantry, helped pick up and deliver donated goods and distribute care to individuals and other charities via his trucking company whilst also volunteering his time to other community and charity organisations.

##### Highly Commended — Moses Vedamuthu

Moses is the founder of Support Organisation for Homeless and Asylum Seekers and has relentlessly distributed food and essentials to vulnerable members of the community during the pandemic.

## Senior Citizen of the Year

### ★ Winner — Bipin Johri

Bipin has volunteered at Dundas Library since September 2015, helping the Dundas community and surrounds with bridging gaps in their digital skills. Through Bipin's workshops, he has focused on supporting adults and seniors like him to adapt with today's technology and lifelong learning needs. Bipin has shown local seniors how to overcome technology hesitancy by teaching them basic computer skills, how to use smart home devices and trained them for online banking and shopping, essential skills during the pandemic. He exhibits great patience and diligence when teaching these skills to those who know very little or nothing at all.

### Highly Commended — Beverly Grace

Beverly has volunteered for Meals on Wheels for over 20 years, distributing meals to the elderly and people with disabilities who are isolated and unable to cook for themselves.

### Highly Commended — Angus Lockhart

Powered by his passion for art, Angus has been volunteering at Parramatta Art Society for the last 12 years and is responsible for running the Hunter Street Gallery located in Parramatta.

## Community Group Award

### ★ Winner — Homicide Victims' Support Group Australia Inc.

The Homicide Victims' Support Group (HVSG) is a not-for-profit organisation located in Parramatta, dedicated to supporting families and friends who have lost a loved one through homicide. Founded in 1993 by a small group of families, HVSG has grown to provide approximately 4,200 family members with support through meetups, counselling, education, advocacy and criminal justice reform. HVSG runs programs for the NSW Police, offering education and coaching in homicide victim support. Through their fundraising efforts HVSG has started construction on 'Grace's Place', a trauma recovery centre established to be a unique place of healing and restoration for grieving children and young people. The HVSG volunteers are always sincere, positive and willing to listen to people from all walks of life.

### Highly Commended — Cycling Without Age – Parramatta Chapter

Cycling Without Age provides rides on trishaw ebikes piloted by volunteer cyclists to those who are no longer able to ride for themselves, including the elderly or people with disabilities.

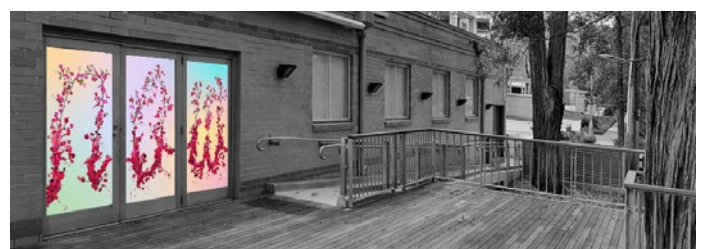

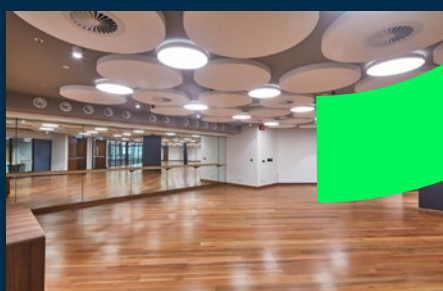
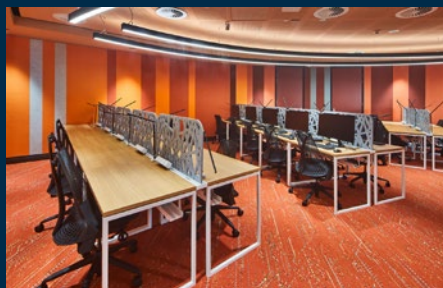

## Telopea's Sturt and Acacia Parks upgrade

City of Parramatta Council's \$5 million revamp of green spaces in Telopea is soon to be complete. The upgrade at Sturt Park will be completed in coming months and will include the City's only flying fox, improved playground equipment, new nature play area, multi use court, seating, sheltered picnic areas and barbecues. The skate bowl will be retained and facilities expanded for the benefit of all ages.

The improved Acacia Park is now open to the public and features barbecues, picnic tables, benches, a new walking track with blocks for strength training and resting, and an accessible platform with a unique view of the Parramatta CBD. The upgrades are being funded by the NSW Government through its Precinct Support Scheme.

# Shops and local park in Ermington upgraded

Council has recently completed extensive capital works upgrades to Bartlett Street Shops and Thomas Wemyss Park in Ermington. The community is now enjoying a new local playground with a variety of play elements to engage children of various age groups and abilities. To enhance the look and feel of the Bartlett Street Shops, the community has also been provided with new pavement, shade tree planting, upgraded garden beds and seating.

With support from the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) Program, further improvements have been delivered for park users. Come and visit the new multi purpose sports court for a game of basketball or netball or have an undercover picnic at one of the new shelters. The installation of a solar powered pedestrian lighting network from Bartlett Street to Vignes Street has also improved accessibility and safety at dawn and dusk.

## Shifting gear Cars, buses and ferries to go electric

Net-zero commitments are driving a world-wide electric vehicle (EV) transition and the City of Parramatta is fuelling change locally by implementing a holistic EV strategy that will make Parramatta and Western Sydney future-ready.

Council has partnered with the Western Sydney Regional Organisation of Councils (WSROC) and seven neighbouring councils to develop the Regional Western Sydney Electric Vehicle Roadmap. The plan sets ambitious 2030 targets for transitioning the region to electric transport. Aligned with NSW Government targets, the plan aims for:

- ➔ at least 50% of council fleets to transition to EV
- ➔ 100% buses to be zero-emission
- ➔ 50% of all taxis, car shares and ferries to be zero-emission.

**The Regional Western Sydney Electric Vehicle Roadmap will help drive Parramatta's net-zero emission goals.**

Transport makes up about one third (5.8m tonnes) of Western Sydney's total emissions, with passenger vehicles accounting for half of that figure. EVs will reduce the region's emissions, reduce pollution, help lessen the impacts of climate change and create new economic opportunities.

## We're leading the charge!

City of Parramatta has introduced a range of Electric Vehicle (EV) initiatives as part of its work to build a resilient city.

➔ Six EV fast-charger spaces have been installed in Parramatta Station

Car Park and one at the Rydalmere Operations Centre

- ➔ Council's Development Control Plans now include guidance on the provision of EV infrastructure
- ➔ EV infrastructure is mandated in new buildings
- ➔ Guidelines for the provision of EV charging on Council land are in development.

## We're making the switch

City of Parramatta and Endeavour Energy are halfway through the largest smart LED streetlighting upgrade in the state with 3,000 lights expected to be installed on main roads across the Parramatta LGA by April.

The switch to high-quality, energy-efficient LED lights will save Council and ratepayers about \$6.2 million in operational and maintenance costs over the next 20 years and help the

City meet its carbon neutral goals. The energy savings made by the new streetlights are enough to power Riverside Theatres for three years!

The project recycles materials such as the metals and glass from the old streetlights and ensures packaging from the new LEDs is recycled.

The \$4 million program is a COVID-19 stimulus project fully funded by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) Program. When complete, 75% of Council's street lighting network will be energy efficient.

# Pruning or removing a tree on your property

Before you prune or remove a tree from your residential or business property you may be required to apply for permission. Tree protection controls for most of the Council area generally apply to any tree, mangrove vegetation or palm, whether it is a native or an exotic species that:

- ➔ has a height equal to or exceeding 5 metres
- ➔ forms part of an Aboriginal object, or that is within an Aboriginal place of heritage significance
- ➔ forms part of a heritage item, or that is within a heritage conservation area
- ➔ is located on public land, irrespective of size
- ➔ is listed on the NSW Heritage Register.

Please check with Council to ensure that the tree you want to prune or remove does not require approval from us. Fines may apply.

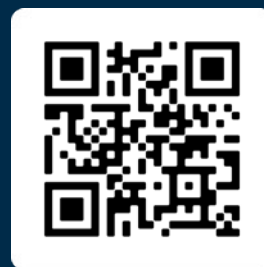
