Small Yellow Bloodwood

With a striking gnarly trunk that has mottled yellow-tan bark and broad grey-green leaves, the Small Yellow Bloodwood makes a lovely addition to any streetscape. In Spring, the tree displays masses of white-yellow flowers which attract bees and nectar-loving birds. It's also a favourite of the Grey-headed Flying Fox. This smaller version is ideal for parks and streets, it adapts to full sun or part shade, will cope with a variety of soil types and is drought tolerant.
