









# Luscious Watergum

In recent years the Luscious Watergum has become a favoured street tree throughout Sydney, and for good reason. The Luscious Watergum is the perfect evergreen shade tree with its dark, glossy leaves and bright, yellow flowers with a mild, sweet fragrance. Luscious Watergum has a smooth greyish-white bark that peels and shows patches of creamy-brown colours. It establishes in 2-4 years and is reasonably long lived. It attracts a variety of native birds, thanks in part to its longer than average flowering period and creates an attractive streetscape with year-round interest.

 <b>Botanic name</b>	Tristania laurina 'Luscious'
 <b>Origin</b>	East coast Australia
 <b>Typical height</b>	5-7m
 <b>Typical width</b>	3m
 <b>Leaf</b>	Glossy green and pointed, oval-like shape
 <b>Bark</b>	Smooth, greyish-white
 <b>Flowers</b>	Yellow with petals set in a slightly overlapping circular pattern, joined in the centre like the spokes of a wheel
 <b>Fruit Pod</b>	Brown capsule
