










White Mahogany

Native to the coastal regions of NSW, the White Mahogany prefers well-drained, moist soils and an open sunny position. Large white flowers appear in Spring and Summer and are a major source of pollen for the bee-keeping industry. Reaching an average of 30 metres and having a dense broad crown, the White Mahogany has all the makings of the ideal shade tree.
