

Chinese Elm

With dense bright foliage, upright vase-shaped habit and intricate scaled bark, the Chinese Elm makes an excellent shade or feature tree. In the warmer months the bright delicate leaf is a deep green but being semi-deciduous will offer a vibrant display of yellow and red in preparation for the Autumn fall. The Chinese Elm enjoys full-sun, moist well-drained soils, and is safe from most pest and disease problems. It can adapt to most adverse ground conditions.
