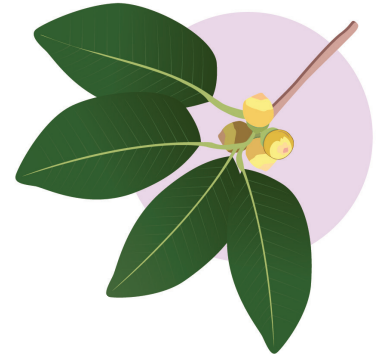


# Hills Weeping Fig

This lush Australian native has become a feature to draw the eye in many open spaces and domestic gardens. Naturally occurring in the rainforests of Queensland, this versatile species with its dense upright habit and evergreen foliage can be regularly pruned to form a hedge or be allowed to take a natural form with a dense canopy and strong, spreading branches. The Hills Weeping Fig enjoys moist, well-drained soils and a full-sun to semi-shade position but is known to adapt to most conditions.
