





Dwarf Photinia

This large evergreen shrub is native to Japan and is best identified by its large vibrant red new-growth and abundant clusters of small white flowers. Though they will naturally grow as a small tree or shrub, they are often pruned to form a hedge where red new-growth is encouraged to display year-round. Requiring very little maintenance and being drought-tolerant, the Dwarf Photinia makes an excellent addition to the Australian garden.
