










Golden Penda

Easily identified by its large nectar-rich golden blooms, the Fairhill Gold is a dwarf variety of Golden Penda reaching 3 to 4 metres in height. An evergreen tree with large glossy leaves, this spectacular flowering tree is perfect for brightening streetscapes and also attracts bees, butterflies and nectar-feeding birds. Establishing in 2 to 4 years, it responds well to mulching and deep watering in dry periods.
