


# Smooth-barked Apple

Loved for its rich red bark and dramatic twisted branches, this fast-growing vibrant native is perfect for large open areas. In Spring, large clusters of cream flowers make this tree even more appealing. Preferring sandy soils but growing well in clay, the Smooth-barked Apple is a popular choice as a feature tree, but requires special care when choosing a location due to its deep roots and large spreading canopy.
