FIVE FAST PLAYS TO TRANSFORM GREATER PARRAMATTA NOW



By 2040, Greater Parramatta will be home to more than 446,000 people. Our fast-growing global city is Greater Sydney's true centre, with more people expected to be living west than east of Parramatta in the next 15 years.

But it needs further government investment to unlock the housing and jobs of the future, better connect communities and realise the City's potential.

Our message to State and Federal Governments is clear:

PLAY 1. Parramatta light rail Stage Two

PLR Stage 2 is the missing link to connect high growth communities like Wentworth Point, Sydney Olympic Park and Melrose Park to the Parramatta CBD and to transport interchanges for heavy rail, Metro and ferry services.

We welcome the NSW Government's election commitment to fast-track Stage 2. But commitment isn't enough to get it done.

PLAY 2. MORE STATIONS FOR METRO WEST

Metro West will be a gamechanger for our City and the communities along its path, doubling rail capacity and providing a 20 minute link between the Parramatta and Sydney CBDs when it opens in the 2030s. But only for communities genuinely connected to it.

There are just four stations planned for the Greater Parramatta and Olympic Peninsula (GPOP) and none between Parramatta and Sydney Olympic Park – one of the fastest growing areas of Sydney.

It's time to: Commit to two additional stations on the Metro West line and a feasibility study for future Metro

lines in GPOP



PLAY 3. A REVITALISED PARRAMATTA RIVER CORRIDOR

We want a global city with a green heart, and that heart is the river corridor which is just a 15 minute walk or cycle from 75 percent of the City's future growth.

It should be a world-class river parkland – a place where you can walk, swim and connect. The Barangaroo of the West.

Our vision includes a green, pedestrianised Civic Link that connects the river back to Parramatta's CBD, drawing the Central River City's defining feature closer to its economic hub.

It's time to: Fund infrastructure along Parramatta River and Civic Link











PLAY 4. ACCELERATION OF WORK ON AN INDIGENOUS CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE

We are a global city that is proud of its indigenous roots.

An Indigenous Centre of Excellence planned for WSU's Parramatta South campus, on Darug land, would put Western Sydney at the forefront of indigenous education, leadership and employment.

A funding commitment of \$78.5 million made through WestInvest will help establish the centre and further funding and collaboration could help amplify its impacts.

PLAY 5. A RESTORED ROXY THEATRE

Parramatta deserves a true arts and cultural precinct anchored by the redeveloped Riverside Theatres, Powerhouse Parramatta and a restored Roxy Theatre.

The heritage-listed Roxy is a Parramatta icon. With construction underway on a nearby Metro Station, it's time to begin the work needed to restore the Roxy to its former glory.

It's time to: Invest public funding to return this public icon of Parramatta into an arts and cultural space
