Spotted Gum

This majestic drought-resistant native tree is beautiful year-round. Stunning when planted as a boulevard, the tree's bark varies in colour from mottled blue-grey, to cream, pink and brown. Its patterned trunk is topped by a cascade of glossy tear-drop-shaped dark-green leaves, and from winter to spring its white flowers are known to be an important source of pollen for native stingless bee honey production.

This tall elegant tree grows a large canopy that provides filtered shade.
